This two-hour session will provide information on integrating Screening Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) with a focus on adolescents.

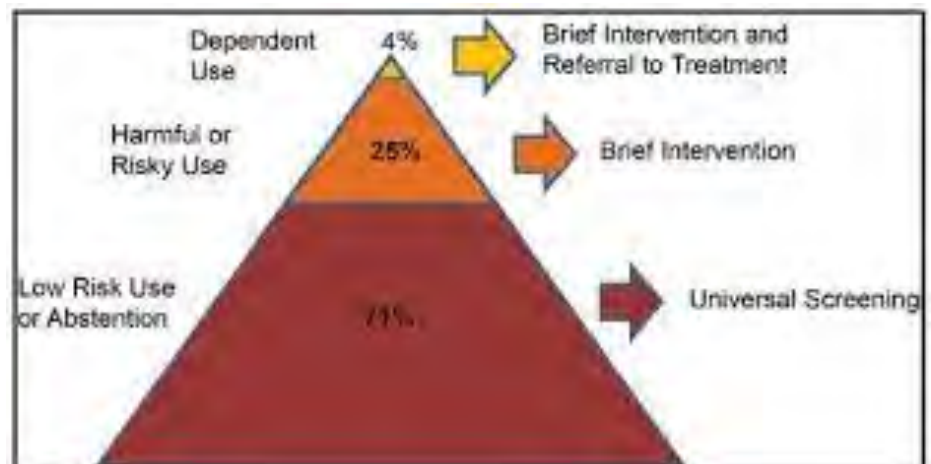
Learning Objectives:
