Alternative Peer Group Q & A with Jordan

What is the purpose of APG?

To provide youth with a positive and safe space to process and deal with issues that arise in their lives.

Who can attend APG?

Any high school aged youth who is directly or indirectly impacted by substance misuse.

What are some key points that make this group stand out from other youth groups?

We abide by 42 CFR which gives the youth the protection of legal confidentiality. We also help with barriers to participation such as providing phones and helping with transportation to and from the group.
